  - Youth exchanges where people coming from different countries can meet and spend some time together to discuss EU topics related to culture, sustainability and more. You can find proposals of organizations organizing such events on various websites, including on Facebook groups. One of the most importants is this: **SALTO-YOUTH Erasmus+**.
