The Institutions of the European Union - part 2



Learning objectives

Throughout this lesson:

- Students will be able to learn basics related to the the Court of Justice of the European Union and the European Central Bank

Materials needed

- -Printed EU institution cards (see attachments below)
- -Printed "guess who am I ?" game (see below)
- -White board + board maker

Structure/activities

- At the beginning, you can start with the quick summary of the pervious institutions.
- At this point, you will introduce only 2 institutions to prevent any information overload since students already introduced to main EU institutions.
- You can start your teaching by introducing the court of justice of the European Union.
- While teaching each institution, you can display your students corresponding cards below.
- You can try to emphasize key words, e.g., checking EU laws & EU institutions for the Court of Justice of the EU and exchange rate policy for the European Central Bank.
- Then you can ask your students to form groups of 3-5. Distribute guess who am I to each group.
- Give them 20 min. to provide answer for each by writing their answers on a paper.
- At the end, you can collect papers, check them during the break, and make clarifications if you see any wrong answers from groups.
- It is essential to do clarifications without telling which group gave the wrong answers.
- This game is not based on competition, thus might be beneficial to make clarifications anonymously.


