

Learning objectives

- Discover the most fascinating information about EU member states.
- Be able to distinguish between several facts related to the country being discussed.
- Help sharpen interpersonal and communication abilities as well as the capacity for paying attention to details.

Materials needed

- Statement and country flashcards (included in this lesson).

Structure/activities

- Divide class into **groups of four to five** (depends on class). "**Eu what's it about**" materials are distributed to each group. They have **20 minutes to read**, they can divide the material between themselves and take notes.
- If the class has computers, a more interactive online version can be used.
- Emphasize that the students should focus on the **words highlighted in bold**.
- After that, remove the materials and **distribute statement cards and country cards (flashcards)**. Each statement needs a country match from the students.
- Then check the answers with students. If you desire, you might encourage pupils by awarding extra credit to those who were most accurate and got most points.



Background information

- **All of the modules of the EU@School E-learning course** can be used as they contain a wealth of additional and interesting information about the EU and its member states.

Assessment

- After reading the information, play an **entertaining flashcard quiz**. Students will be more interested in reading the distributed materials on information about the EU because the game includes a competitive element.

Latvia

X was the first Soviet republic to **declare independence from the USSR** in March 1990.

X is the richest European country, with many banks and insurance companies based here.
