Learning objectives

- Learn the values of the European Union
- Learn examples of the values

Materials needed

- 2 sets of flashcards (printed or digital) with the links provided in the text

Structure/activities

- First, you can explain to your young students that the European Union is based on 6 key values laid out in article 2 of the Lisbon Treaty and the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights.

- You can print the flashcards to have them in your classroom, or decide to create them digitally with some websites like Flashmind or Quizlet.

- In this second game, on one side there is the name of the value, and on the other side there is an example of the value.





EU citizens has political rights and can vote in the elections of the EU Parliament




It is about equal rights for all citizens. All citizens are equal before the law.
